MEN WANT BETTER BIRTH CONTROL OPTIONS

A recent article by Valerie Tarico highlighted the importance of – and interest in – what men think about new contraceptive methods. She cited <u>a small survey</u> conducted by a student intern on attitudes about male contraception.
